Midwest Trail Ride, Norman, Indiana

Midwest Trail Ride is a wonderful horsemen's camp in Norman, Indiana. The facility has 200 permanent campsites with water and electric hookups at each site with stalls right behind your trailer. There is a full service tack shop, shower and bathroom house, screened in dining area, dump station, and miles of trail connecting to the Hoosier National Forest. An additional nominal bridle tag fee will be charged if you care to ride out and onto the Forestry Trails. We'll also plan some fun things to do on Saturday evening for those interested!

New this year 2 night package or 3 night package !!!

Arrival is planned for Thursday any time after noon for the 3 night package or Friday any time after noon for the 2 night package. Camping locations will be assigned as you register for the event. If you would like to camp next to someone just let me know when registering. Please sign up early...we have reserved a series of connecting campsites so we can all be near each other and we need to know how many to plan for.

First, Do **NOT** Use Internet Directions! e.g. Mapquest, Yahoo Map. They will take you along narrow bridges and gravel roads.

From SR 46, turn south on SR 446. Once you pass over Lake Monroe, in 7 miles you'll see the Lawrence County Sign on the right. Hunter's Creek Rd is the next street on the left. Turn left at Hunter's Creek Rd and make an immediate right turn. We're 1/2 mile on the left.

From SR 50, turn north on SR 446. Hunter's Creek Rd is 8 miles north on the right hand side. You'll pass over SR 58 and then you'll pass through an area of steep sided rocks. Hunter's Creek Rd is the 2nd turn on the right after the rocks. Turn right on Hunter's Creek Rd and make an immediate right turn. We're 1/2 mile on the left.
